



Cyber Crime Awareness Program organised by NSS Cell, Cluster University Srinagar in Collaboration with Abdul Ahad Azad Memorial College

The NSS Cell of Cluster University Srinagar, in collaboration with Abdul Ahad Azad Memorial College, Srinagar, organized an awareness program which focused on cyber-crimes and threats. The event aimed to educate students, especially females, about the rising dangers in the digital world and equip them with preventive measures.

Mr. Mohd Yaseen Kichloo, IPS, a cyber specialist from J&K Police, was invited as the resource person and chief guest. Mr. Kichloo discussed various cybercrimes, including juice jacking, cyber defamation, deep fake technology, spoofing, email bombing, salami attacks, and skimming. He also highlighted real-life cases that surfaced in Jammu and Kashmir recently, particularly focusing on banking frauds.

In addition to cyber-crimes, Mr. Kichloo explained the importance of understanding India's cyber laws and the preventive measures students can take to protect themselves online. He stressed the importance of being vigilant, particularly for female students, as they are often targeted by cyber criminals. Mr. Kichloo also touched upon the issue of drug addiction, offering his support to the college in fighting the menace by working closely with the anti-narcotic department of J&K Police.
