## National Integration Camp (NIC) 2024, 12<sup>th</sup> November to 18<sup>th</sup> November, 2024 at CRSU, Jind

Day 1: 12<sup>th</sup> November 2024

### Registration & Inauguration Ceremony

National Integration Camp forms and integral part of National Service Scheme. It has a special appeal to the youth as it provides unique opportunities to the students for group living, collective experience sharing and constant interaction with the community and install the spirit of National Integration through various activities.

The Government of Haryana, State NSS Cell in collaboration with CRSU, Jind, Haryana organised a National Integration Camp from 12.11.2024 to 18.11.2024 on the theme “Youth for My Bharat & Youth for Digital Literacy”. The organizing committee managed the camp of NSS volunteers of 14 States in around 230 numbers including PO's.
